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Change “twelve tribes” into something else by precisely following each command below. Write your result on each line as you follow the commands step by step.



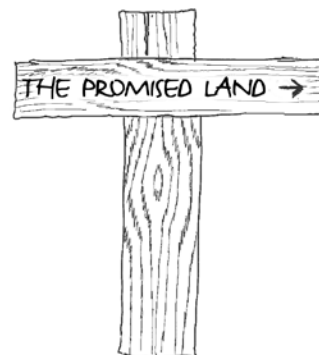

- _____ Change the 2nd L to an O.
- _____ Exchange the 2nd E with the P.
- _____ Move the 2nd D to immediately after the 1st M.
- _____ Place an N after the 5th consonant.
- _____ Drop the last three letters.
- _____ Place the 7th, 8th, and 9th letters to the front.
- _____ Remove the 4th consonant from the right.
