

ABOUT THE BOOK

Most people think of Noah as the man who built a large ship and spent months caring for thousands of animals. But who was he and what events shaped who he would become? We wrote this novel to challenge Christians to look closely at the life of a man who walked with God. *Noah: Man of Destiny* takes readers on a captivating, coming-of-age journey through the pre-Flood world. Noah learns more about the Most High while standing against a sinister belief system emerging throughout the land. Whether escaping legendary beasts, tracking kidnappers, or pursuing his future wife, Noah acquires the skills he will need when God calls him to his greatest adventure: surviving the global Flood.

- Witness the struggle of a righteous man's battle against a culture that thought of evil continually
- Explore what it may have been like for a righteous man to relate to God before the Bible was written
- Non-fiction portions in the back of the book help explain historical concepts and provide teaching sections that deal with issues and concerns that arise in the account.
- Offers "Encounter This" section at the end that shows the various items described in the books that can be seen at the Ark Encounter.

SUGGESTED INTERVIEW QUESTIONS:

1. What made you decide to write Noah's backstory?
2. Noah was 600 when the Flood came, how much of his story do you cover?
3. How is Noah different in your novel than the way we often see him portrayed in Sunday school, books, or Hollywood?
 - a. Since the Bible doesn't give us a lot of information about Noah, you filled in details using artistic license. How did you determine how much artistic license to use when fleshing out the life of a biblical hero?
4. Since Noah lived before the Bible was written, what was it like for him to relate to God?
5. Does the Noah in this novel match the Noah that visitors meet at the Ark Encounter?
6. Can you describe the pre-Flood world that you've crafted? For example:
 - a. Did people really live over 900 years? Did they mature slower?
 - b. Did people live with dinosaurs?
 - c. What was their technology like?
 - d. What was the culture and climate like?
 - e. How did you portray an extremely wicked world like the Bible describes?
7. Do you have a favorite scene or character?
8. Why did you choose to use fiction to teach non-fiction?
9. What are some of the non-fiction elements you address in the book?
10. Can you describe the "Borrowed from the Bible" and the "Encounter This" sections of the book?
11. The novel ends with a sneak preview of book 2 (Noah: Man of Resolve). When will this be published and what can readers anticipate?

SPECIFIC QUESTIONS ABOUT THE WRITING PROCESS (if interested):

1. What kind of research did you do for this book?
2. How was the work divided between two authors?
3. Can you describe the writing process?
4. What are the pros and cons of having a male/female writing team? How did your different perspectives come together for this book?
5. Do you share a similar writing style or will readers be able to determine who wrote what?
6. Did you have any differences of opinion regarding characters and story?
If so, how were they resolved?
